- *First Meeting*
 - What will be discussed at the first meeting with the nurse?
 - Information about the treatment, immunoglobulin and the progress



- ***Plan of Care***
 - I.V. Protocol (at the hospital and home therapy)
 - S.C. Protocol

Adjust and plan individualized education.



- ***Delivery of Care***
 - I.V. Protocol (hospital and home therapy)
 - S.C. Protocol
 - Training session



- ***Evaluation/Follow up***
 - I.V. Protocol

 - S.C. Protocol
 - Every 3 months in the first year
 - Commonly, every 6 months thereafter
